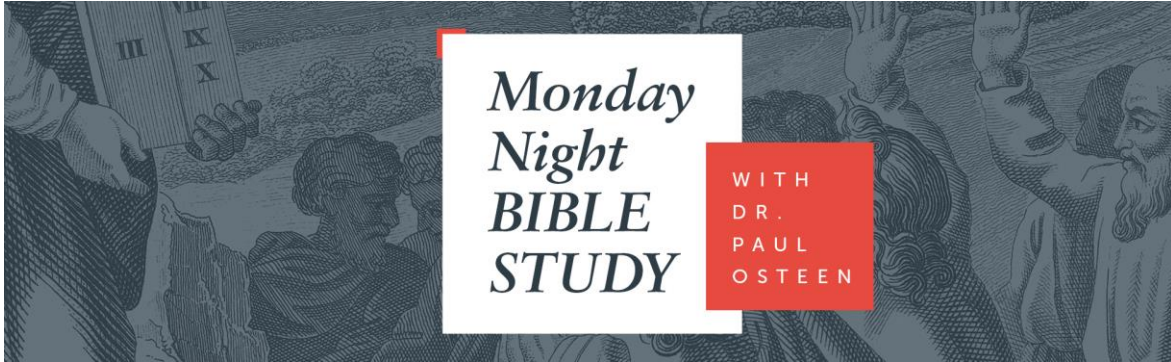

HOW TO BEGIN TO MANAGE OUR FINANCES WISELY:

- 1. Start managing wisely right where you are. Luke 16:10-11
- 2. If you are married, let me STRONGLY encourage you to do everything you can do to come into agreement in regards to your finances and financial goals. Deuteronomy 32:30, Matthew 13:19, Psalm 133:1,3
- 3. Show God that He is first in your finances by giving Him the first 10% of what He entrusts to you.
- 4. Be your best at work.
- 5. Don't spend more than you earn.
- 6. Avoid credit card debt at all costs.
- 7. Be willing to be 'uncomfortable' in the short-term in order to experience freedom in the long-term.
