Text: Job 5

- God wants to do UNUSUAL things among us!
- The Bible is full of miracles—and what God did in the Bible He will do for us today!

Foundational Scriptures:

Job 5:9, Psalm 77:13-14, Psalm 90:15-17 (Passion), Mark 6:2, Luke 4:40-41, John 21:25, Acts 19:11, I Corinthians 12:28

- We are the Church and we should expect MIRACLES in our lives.
- We should pray for miracles and healing.
- We should pray for others to receive miracles!
- Let's start exercising our faith for MORE MIRACLES!

Four Greek Words Also Used To Designate Miracles:

1. Semeion means sign. Mark 16:20
2. Terata means wonders. Acts 6:8
3. Dunameis means might works. Acts 2:22
4. Erga means works. John 5:20

Many Miracles In The Bible Occurred:

1. When someone had faith for a specific miracle.
 - The person was determined. They would not take NO for an answer! Matthew 20
 - Faith is daring to believe what others may not believe.
 - Faith is being willing to step out of your comfort zone—and do something out of the ordinary.
 - Faith believes it CAN be done when everybody else says it CANNOT be done.
 - Your faith pulls on the power of God. Matthew 13:58
 - A lack of faith ties the hands of God, but faith moves God to act!
2. After an act of obedience.
 - It seems that an act in the natural always precedes a supernatural act. Your action or obedience in the natural brings about the supernatural.
 - God doesn't always do things the way we think He should. We have our plan, but God's got a better plan. John 4
3. When someone brought a person to Jesus.
 - God wants to use you to tell people about His miracle-working power!
4. When God reveals Himself in a special way through miracles. Exodus 15:22-26
 - God wants you to know Him in that miracle; to know His character and His goodness.
